

SSVF–SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERANS & THEIR FAMILIES

This program will assist very low income Veteran's families experiencing Homelessness in being housed or prevent Veteran's families from being homeless.

SSVF – Rapid Rehousing/Prevention Assistance Requirements:

- A veteran or a member of a family in which the head of household or the spouse is a Veteran.
- Household that is either at or below 50% area median Income.
- Occupies permanent housing but at risk of becoming “literally” homeless with a magistrate’s eviction notice.
- Is homeless and scheduled to become a resident of permanent housing within 90 days.
- Has exited permanent housing within 90 prior days to seek other housing that is responsive to Veteran’s income capabilities, needs and preferences.

Clients will be required to provide the following documentations:

1. Social Security cards for everyone in the household
2. Picture ID for all adults in the household
3. Proof of Veteran status (i.e. Military ID, VA Benefits Card, Copy of DD-214, etc.)
4. Proof of Income (Veterans benefits, employment, disability, child support, TANF, or any other form of verifiable income)
5. Proof of Homelessness (Shelter referral, written, outreach, etc.)

Please note, if client does not have one of the aforementioned documents, we will help in acquiring them.

SSVF – Prevention

All of the above and:

1. Copy of Lease (must state that if utilities are disconnected tenant will be evicted)
2. Bill in termination

Prior to assistance: A Housing Habitability Inspection must be performed

Remember: If not but for our assistance, veteran will be homeless.
